Who should purchase noxious weed free forage and straw?

- Consumers who wish to prevent the spread of noxious weeds on their land and that of their neighbors;
- Entities that need third party certification to comply with contracts issued by federal, state and local authorities requiring the use of noxious weed free mulch; and
- Forage producers who must have third party documentation to comply with rules and regulations governing the transport of forage to some parks and lands controlled by the Bureau of Land Management.
